## SCOTUS REVERSES PRACTICE OF DEFERRING TO FEDERAL AGENCY RULES INTERPRETING LAW

JUNE 28, 2024: Just last Friday the U.S. Supreme Court issued decisions in a pair of companion cases, overturning longstanding precedent that instructed federal courts to defer to agency interpretations of the laws they enforce. The precedent was established by the Court forty years ago, in Chevron v. Natural Resources Defense Counsel. The

holding of that case, which came to be known as "Chevron deference," instructed federal courts to generally defer to federal regulations issued by agencies that were assumed to be better suited to interpret the laws they were entrusted to enforce. However, in a 6-3

decision overturning Chevron, Chief Justice John Roberts, writing for the majority, declared that the Chevron doctrine gave too much power to unelected federal bureaucrats and placed the administrative branch of government, above the judicial branch and its role in interpreting the law. As a result of these rulings, courts must now exercise independent judgment in deciding whether an agency has acted within the authority granted to it by Congress. This is a highly controversial ruling not only because it is yet another decision of the current Court that overturns decades-old precedent (think Dobbs and Roe v. Wade), but because it unequivocally "clips the wings" of federal agencies and renders them less influential. These rulings may have a profound impact on the

agencies Wessels Sherman deals with on behalf of our clients (e.g. NLRB, EEOC, DOL) and be welcomed by employers everywhere as a sort of "deregulation." The cases are Loper Bright Enterprises et al. v. Gina Raimondo; and Relentless Inc. et al. v. Dept of Commerce et al.

These decisions come at a time when federal administrative

agencies have issued a landslide of new regulations that take significant liberties in interpreting federal statutes. As just one example, the EEOC's final rule on the Pregnant Workers Fairness Act (PWFA) issued in April, interpreted that law so broadly that it included

protections of the right not to be pregnant (i.e. abortion rights). This sparked lawsuits challenging the EEOC's authority to essentially re-write the PWFA. No doubt the plaintiffs in those lawsuits will be amending their arguments to include the new SCOTUS precedent directing the courts not to give deference to the EEOC's interpretation of the law if it exceeded its authority.

#### The Importance of Family Dinners

The Family Dinner. It sounds like such a humble term on the surface. For some, family dinners might even sound old-fashioned or a thing of the past. With non-stop to-do lists, work commitments, long commutes, evening activities, and just being overwhelmed by day-to-day obligations, the family dinner is something that is too often pushed aside. We eat on the go, in the car, at different times than the kids, or worse we rush ourselves or our families to hurry up and finish dinner so we can move to the next thing.

But the term has real power. Power to transform your family relationships and power to help your kids in some significant ways.

We get how hard this can be. Gathering a busy family around the dinner table is no easy feat. Family dinners take patience and perseverance. However, like most things in life worth doing, we think you will find the effort well worth it.

#### Why are family dinners so important?

The research is significant. Family dinners around the table matter. Why? Here are some compelling reasons:

- 1. **Stronger Family Bonds**: teens that have regular family dinners just a few times a week are more likely to have better relationships with their parents. Although that chitchat over the dinner table might seem insignificant, it does matter. It is not the topic that counts, it is just showing up, making eye contact, and listening.
- Better Performance in School: kids that have dinner with their families regularly on average do better in school. They get better grades, better test scores, and lower dropout rates.
- 3. **Healthier families**: cooking dinner at home and eating meals at the table keeps take-out and processed foods to a minimum. True, it does take a bit of effort but when you think of what is at stake, such as your health, it is hard to argue it is not worth it.

4. **Screen Free Time**: having regular family dinners also allows you to declare much-needed "screen-free" time. Have the kids (and parents) leave the phones when they come to the table for dinner. It might be met with some grumbles, but if you stick to it your family will get used to it and most likely will welcome the break.

#### How to make it happen:

"One of the simplest and most effective ways for parents to be engaged in their teen's lives is by having frequent family dinners," says Joseph Califano Jr., chairman and president of The National Center on Addiction and Substance Abuse at Columbia University (CASA).

- Declare two to three nights as family dinner nights: review your schedule for the week, taking into account after-school commitments and work schedules. Pick two or three nights when everyone will be home. If you come up with zero days, consider rescheduling or canceling certain events so you can make this happen. declare those nights Family Dinner Nights. Announce the days and times at the start of the week in whatever way works for you-post it on the fridge, on a calendar, or send everyone a group text. Ideally, this would be the same nights each week but understandably this might not always be possible. Do the best you can and remember the objective - get your family into the routine of sitting down together regularly. If your kids are older, ask them to plan their schedules accordingly, whether that is their study sessions or time with friends. Accept this might be challenging at first if this is a new routine. However, it will get easier and the rewards are huge.
- 2. Come to the table without your devices: this is so so important and applies to parents and the kids. Put your phone away, far enough from the table so you won't be tempted to see who is texting or messaging you. No phones at the tables mean family members are looking and listening to each other, not staring at a screen. I keep a basket on a nearby counter and ask everyone to dump their phones into it before they sit down. Whatever that message or text is, it can wait.
- 3. Have a plan for your dinners: a huge reason why family dinners often fall apart is not having a plan. We hear this all the time! A lack of a plan is so often the reason we grab take out or just wing it, with everyone doing their own thing. Instead, create your plan at the start of the week. Then, make sure you have all the ingredients on hand. A last-minute trip to the grocery store to shop for that night's meal is never fun. 4. **Get your family involved in the prep**: when it makes sense, ask your family members to help get the meal on the table. There are lots of simple tasks you can assign, allowing you to focus on the main meal: make a simple salad, set the table, fill water glasses, chop the veggie to put in the steamer. This means less work for you, and contributes to the overall feeling of togetherness at the same time. All those little moments add up!

If you are just getting started on establishing this tradition, be patient. It will take time to get everyone on board. And remember that it is not about fancy or complicated dinner recipes, it is about the company and the memories being made around the table.






















## MEMBER APPRECIATION PICNIC FUN IN THE SUN

## NEW ILICA DRAINAGE WORKSHOP SERIES SHOWCASES CONSERVATION DRAINAGE BENEFITS

During a meeting last March, the Education Committee discussed the current educational needs of ILICA members as they continued planning trainings and events for the year to address these objectives. At that time, it was recognized that many contractors, landowners, and producers still have a general lack of knowledge regarding Illinois's Nutrient Loss Reduction Strategy (INLRS) and the conservation drainage practices recommended therein, despite the document being released in 2015. Based on the INLRS's pending interim goals and the recent influx of government funds dedicated to conservation, the committee decided to develop a workshop series to educate contractor members, producers, and landowners on these water quality topics, replacing ILICA's traditional drainage workshop offering for the year. With the addition of conservation drainage site tours and a few extra topics geared solely towards contractors in the afternoons, ILICA's newest drainage workshop series was established and hosted at three locations across the state this summer.

The single day workshops were very well received and provided information about the history and progress of the Illinois Nutrient Loss Reduction Strategy, the benefits of edge

of field practices and how to identify suitable sites for installation, cost share opportunities, and wetland jurisdictional and determination information. They also included content on WOTUS, conservation drainage business opportunities, one-call law updates, trench safety, surveying basics, and drainage pipe installation specifications. With the help of sponsors, partner organizations and agencies supporting the workshops, the trainings were well attended by a mix of contractors, landowners, producers, farm managers, and government agency staff who were subjected

to jampacked agendas and opportunities to speak with agency and industry professionals to answer any of their conservation drainage related questions.

#### The Connection Between Gut & Brain Health

Recent research indicates that the communication between your brain and your gut plays a crucial role in your overall health. Scientists suggest this connection may be the reason you feel "butterflies" when you're nervous or "sick to your stomach" when you're dreading something. It also has a significant impact on your overall health.

#### What Is the Brain-gut Connection?

The vagus nerve connects your brain and your gut (known as the gut-brain axis) and sends signals in both directions. The brain and the gut both contain neurons that tell your body how to behave. They also contain neurotransmitters, which control feelings and emotions. Interestingly, many neurotransmitters are produced in the gut. In fact, the largest amount of your body's serotonin is produced there, impacting mood, perception, attention and memory.

#### How Does the Gut-brain Axis Work?

Your brain directly impacts the function of your stomach and intestines. For example, chronic stress can cause gastrointestinal problems. The connection also works in reverse. The intestine can send troubled signals to the brain that cause anxiety, stress or depression. An unhealthy gut is also linked to dementia and lowered cognitive functions.

#### Tips for Improving Gut Health

Improving your gut health can contribute to brain health, enhance cognitive function and help ward off disease. You can improve gut health with the following foods:

- Diverse foods
- ► Lots of fruits, vegetables and legumes
- ► High-fiber foods
- Fermented foods (e.g., yogurt, kimchi and kefir)
- Prebiotic foods
- ▶ Whole grains
- ► Plant-based foods
- ► Foods with polyphenols (e.g., red wine, grape skins, onions and blueberries)
- Probiotics

#### Conclusion

Your gut health significantly impacts the health of your brain and body. By eating foods that promote gut health, you may experience improved focus, better mental health and reduced risk of disease.

#### Most Americans Should Be Screened for Anxiety

Amid a mental health crisis, the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force (Task Force) recommends that all adults under the age of 65 get screened for anxiety regularly. Last year, the Task Force also amended recommendations to include children ages 8 to 17. This means all people 8 to 65 should be screened for anxiety.

The Task Force stops short of recommending anxiety screening for adults over 65 because many common symptoms of aging (e.g., pain, fatigue and trouble sleeping) are also symptoms of anxiety.

#### Why Is Anxiety Screening Important?

Anxiety is common. According to the American Psychiatric Association, nearly 30% of adults experience anxiety disorders at some point in their lives.

Anxiety usually begins in childhood and early adulthood, and symptoms usually decline with age. It may look different for everyone. However, common symptoms include anxious thoughts that are difficult to control, fatigue, irritability, restlessness, sleep problems, and unexplained aches and pains.

Screening is crucial for diagnosis, as anxiety symptoms might not be noticeable during regular doctor visits. If you have symptoms of anxiety, contact your medical health care professional immediately. Don't wait for your annual physical.

#### September Is National Suicide Prevention Month

Mental illness and mental health issues often contribute to suicide. Everyone can help prevent suicide. You can save lives by dialing 988, the National Suicide and Crisis Lifeline (the Lifeline). Similar to calling 911 for physical emergencies, 988 is for people in emotional distress or suicidal crisis.
