THE 2024 DRAIN FOR THE CURE IS HERE

Springfield Plastics' annual campaign to aid cancer research in Illinois and Iowa kicks off

SPRINGFIELD, Illinois – Springfield Plastics is kicking off its annual Drain for the Cure fundraiser. The fundraiser supports cancer research, prevention, and treatment at Simmons Cancer Institute at Southern Illinois University School of Medicine in Springfield, Illinois, and John Stoddard Cancer Center at UnityPoint Health in Des Moines, Iowa.

Started in 2014, Springfield Plastics' Drain for the Cure campaign has raised more than \$850,000 over the years. Last year's campaign raised over \$186,000 and hopes are to surpass that number this year. All donations received during the month of October will be matched by Springfield Plastics (up to \$50,000 total).

"We've been overwhelmed by the support of our customers, vendors, employees, and community members in building this effort into what it is today," said Steve Baker, President of Springfield Plastics. "I don't think any of us imagined that one day we would cross the \$1,000,000 mark in donations through Drain for the Cure. With the continued generosity of past and new donors, we aim to surpass that goal this year."

Simmons Cancer Institute and John Stoddard Cancer Center offer patient care, cancer research, and complementary programs and therapies for patients and families. Their access to national and international research allows them to perform clinical trials and research studies aimed at finding new, more effective cancer treatments.

"We've seen firsthand the impact these two institutions are having in the fight against cancer," said Jennifer Furkin, Vice President of Springfield Plastics. "Every one of us has been touched by cancer either directly or through family and friends. Our hope is that these funds will assist in finding new therapies and make them readily available to patients to beat this terrible disease."
