

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



As we approach the official start of summer, my mind, or what is left of it, thinks back to the night 77 years ago when a man almost 10 years younger than myself held the fate of millions in his hands. He said go. Then, in marginal weather with fog over the beaches, the

plans for the liberation of Europe were set into motion once more. Into the dark went the airborne divisions scattered all over into a hostile land. At first light on a rising tide over mined obstructions went the landing craft carrying soldiers so seasick they didn't care if they lived or died. By day's end, some 175,000 men had come ashore with hundreds of tanks, thousands of trucks and jeeps, artillery, food, ammunition, and one little spotter airplane. Each one of us probably has a connection to that historical day. For me, one of my high school teachers piloted one of those landing craft, and no doubt many of the LST's were built in Seneca just a few blocks from where my high school is.

Perhaps by now, you are wondering what this has to do with ILICA; quite a bit actually. First, there is the complexity of the planning to undertake the operation. One has to put together the men, material, and plan of action to storm a beach or to shape a waterway or to tile a field. Then as all good generals say, plans are all until the battle starts, afterward they are next to nothing because you really didn't know about the enemy's

actual strength or about that soft spot in the waterway or about that tile line you hit that is starting to float the tile you are installing. Good men rise to the challenge from taking out those beach defenses to firming that soft spot to rushing to drill a hole in that tile before it goes underwater. You rely on your training, experience, and creativity and just get the job done.


Which brings me to this point, it is going to be a busy summer for ILICA. We have 3 project demonstrations to do starting July 19-24 with another wetland project near Broadmoor followed by a tube and riser and bioreactor project near Blandinsville August 9-14. Then we

finish up with a bioreactor and tiling demonstration at the Farm Progress Show August 31-September 2. And I am sure we won't have the casualty rate like they did on the beaches of France, so don't be scared to come and help. While not really a comparison to the brotherhood bonds formed in combat, there is that same feeling of accomplishment when you count on each other and get the job done. For those newer members or less involved, these shows are one of the best ways to get to know others in the association, try new or different machines, and learn some new techniques.

A couple final things before I end. First, a reminder of the summer national meeting at Niagara Falls this July which sounds like it could be really interesting. There are lots of things to explore in that area once you get done watching water go over a cliff. As a past national officer, once I started going to national conventions, I got hooked on them. To me, if you can make one, it is well worth the effort. And the other thing, if you know a veteran, shake their hand. If they are past, give them a salute. We owe them far more than an ungrateful government ever provides. Hopefully, we won't need them again to keep our liberty, freedom, and self determination intact.

LICA LEGISLATIVE/REGULATORY PRIORITIES ESTABLISHED



National LICA has developed a set of legislative and regulatory priorities to guide our efforts this year. The Executive Committee has reviewed and discussed the priorities and looks forward

to continuing the dialogue on these issues with other LICA members and most importantly, government and elected officials.

The priorities – targeted to improve the business climate for land improvement contractors - fall under the following subject headings:

- Protect and Enhance our Environment
- Invest in Infrastructure
- Develop and Mentor the Next Generation of Skilled, Technical Workers
- Support Farm Bill Programs for Reauthorization, specifically Title II, Conservation
- Implement LICA Action Steps from the NRCS, NACD and ADMC MOUs

LICA 2021 Legislative/Regulatory Priorities

The Land Improvement Contractors Association (LICA) is an organization of earthmoving contractors dedicated to the professional installation of soil and water conservation practices protecting the environment and improving agricultural productivity. LICA members have installed many of the conservation practices on the U.S. landscape over time. LICA is focused on encouraging high standards of workmanship in natural resource management, land improvement practices, and promoting private enterprise in land improvement contracting. Below are the LICA legislative and regulatory priorities for 2021.

Protect and Enhance our Environment

Federal environmental policy should support land improvement managed by locally led, voluntary approach to conservation supported by science to achieve the healthy soils and clean water while also addressing climate change. The Clean Water Act works best when policies lead to sound management of natural resources that improve water quality and increase agricultural land value and productivity. Scientifically developed farming practices improve the environment, reduce pollution, and improve productivity while reducing costs. Federal sup-

port should focus on collaboration, conservation incentives and market-based and watershed-specific approaches.

Invest in Infrastructure

A modern infrastructure system is essential to the nation's economy and to ensure the safe, efficient movement of all people and goods. Local, state and federal officials – and the private sector – must identify new revenue sources to rebuild and improve our nation's infrastructure. Our nation faces a significant shortfall in dams, levees, airports, broadband, pipe and water system investments. Improving rural infrastructure is particularly in need of investment to improve farm to market and broadband capacity.

Develop and Mentor the Next Generation of Skilled, Technical Workers

Federal laws should be updated to reflect the current workforce needs. Congress must also increase funding for Carl D. Perkins Act and other programs that support providing skilled technical education opportunities. Additionally, Congress should expand need-based Pell Grant eligibility to qualifying, short-term career and technical education programs and incentivize tuition reimbursement by making company contributions to their employees' student loan payments tax-free, a benefit to both the employer and the employee.

Support Farm Bill Programs for Reauthorization, specifically Title II, Conservation

The farm bill's investment in agricultural research and conservation programs is critical to ensuring the productivity and sustainability on our farms and in our domestic food supply. LICA encourages the support of conservation delivery partnership that conservation districts across the country participate in by providing conservation planning, technical and financial assistance alongside state conservation agencies and the National Resources Conservation Service (NRCS).

Implement LICA Action Steps from the NRCS, NACD and ADMC MOUs

LICA has recently signed Memorandums of Understandings (MOUs) with three critical partners: National Resource Conservation Service (NRCS), National Association of Conservation Districts (NACDs) and Agricultural Drainage Management Coalition (ADMC). Recognizing the safety and health challenges presented by COVID, priority should be given to execute the MOUs to the benefit of land improvement contractors and our industry partners.



But summer is just around the corner and offers lots of opportunities to get outside, learn something new, and make memories with the ones you love. Chicago is always a top destination in Illinois for summertime trips, but there are also many other places in Illinois that are worth exploring within a few hours away. To help you get excited for summer and all the fun travel experiences it brings, here are some top summer getaway destinations in Illinois.

I&M Canal Boat Rides, Channahon



Get owews in I If you drive about an hour and a half from Chicago, you can reach the small community of Channahon and go for a boat ride on the I&M Canal. The Illinois & Michigan (I&M) Canal has been a National Heritage Area for over 35 years and offers mulepulled boat rides on boats that are replicas of an 1840s canal boat. Yet this is not just any ordinary ride on the water. The boats are equipped with periodclothed storytellers to let riders step back in time and learn about Illinois history. The tours typically run from May to October. In addition to boat rides, you can bring your family here to enjoy a scenic bike ride along the I&M Canal Trail, which follows over seven miles of waterway. Bring your own bike or use the bike share program for those age 18 and older.

Matthiessen State Park, Oglesby

Another fun weekend getaway in Illinois involves taking a trip to Matthiessen State Park in Oglesby. This trip is about two hours from Chicago but feels like a whole other world, especially when you notice your child's face light up while seeing a waterfall for the very first time. At this state park, you can see more than just waterfalls too as you explore the beautiful rock formations, vegetation, and wildlife in the park. This is an ideal getaway spot to bring the whole family to because of the great picnic facilities onsite.

Starved Rock State Park, Utica



A popular getaway in Illinois, Starved Rock State Park is one of the most beautiful places in the entire Midwest and another must-visit park for your summer getaway itinerary. There's no place quite like it in the region for rugged canyons, awe-inspiring bluffs, and outdoor adventure close to home. If

you're coming from the Chicago area, you can get here in about two hours. Starved Rock State Park of-

Attendees must agree to follow all local protocols, including but not limited to:



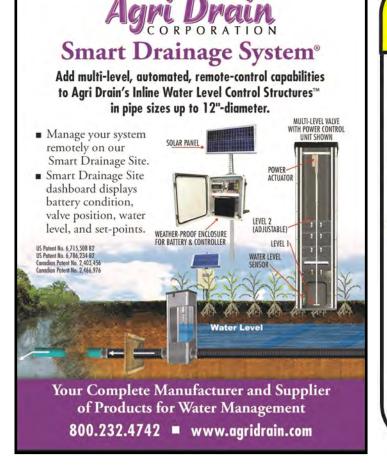

SAFETY FEATURE: EXCAVATION SITE SAFETY PRACTICES

Each year, trench collapses are one of the leading causes of injury and death on construction sites. Of these incidents, most of the victims were new employees who lacked training and guidance prior to entering the job site. Sadly, most accidents were preventable.

Whether you are new or a seasoned employee, it is essential that you adhere to Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) regulations to ensure the safety of the entire work crew.

Trench Requirements

- Trenches 5 feet or more in depth require a protective system.
- Trenches that are 4 feet or more require a safe means of entrance and exit.
- Trenches that are 20 feet or more require an exit system designed by a registered professional engineer.

Protective Systems

The designated competent person should inspect the area and determine which protective system will suit the job site and soil most effectively. This is essential, as equipment movement, underground utilities and vibrations can cause a surcharge load on the sides of the trench, forcing it to cave in on the workers inside. The following are the most commonly used protective systems:

- **Sloping:** Protects workers by cutting back the trench wall at an angle inclined away from the excavation
- Shoring: Protects workers by installing aluminum hydraulic supports to prevent soil movement
- Shielding: Protects workers by using trench boxes to prevent cave-ins

In addition to one of these three safety measures, a low-traffic zone must be designated around the trench allowing only essential equipment to enter. This will minimize the amount of vibration to which the trench is exposed.

Avoiding Accidents

Excavation accidents can occur if the underground utilities are not located and removed prior to digging a trench. Contact your local one-call system to locate all of the utility lines. Then, label or remove them to prevent injury.

Trench accidents can also happen if safe entrance and exit routes are not present or adequate for the situation. Workers may slip back into the trench as they are trying to climb up a ladder if it is unsupported, placed on a steep slope or is poorly built.

To prevent injury while entering and exiting a trench, only the designated competent person should approve the structural device used. Workers should also place the ladder in a trench shield while trying to enter and exit to avoid a cave-in.

By complying with OSHA regulations and following these safety precautions, the risk of injury at your job site will be greatly reduced. Illinois LICA wants everyone on our team to keep safety in mind!
